Brief History of Ontario Ice Sheets



• The Wintario glory years of funding and development – Wintario turns 50 in 2025

- Living on the assumption of economic spin off from recreation
- Over building and underachieving the chronic habit of constructing and under
 planning for the operation and management of recreational assets

• Learning as they go...has to stop



Current Pressure Points



- The price of user fees but it's for the kids!
- The non-users unknowing contribution to others recreational experience
- The current state of unfunded recreation facility liability aging assets
- Mass loss of a skilled recreational labour pool post pandemic

- An increase in regulated compliance expectation
- A blind reliance on refrigeration service contractors to keep the operation safe and compliant
- Defining who is actually in charge of an unattended registered ice sheet refrigeration plant



The Changing Ice Sheet Refrigeration Landscape



• Installation of self-contained refrigeration packages without any focus on operator qualifications

• Expansion of new refrigerants and equipment

• Installation of sophisticated heating, ventilation, air-conditioning and dehumidification systems without investing in operator training to maximize efficiencies



Minimum Ice Sheet Industrial Refrigeration Regulatory Compliance



Ice Sheet facility management must have a strong working knowledge of the following:

- Health and Safety MLITSD
- Refrigerant Release MOECP
- Emergency Management OFM
- Operating Engineers Regulation TSSA
- Boiler and Pressure Vessel Regulation -TSSA

 No change in any Regulation – just more clarification of the roles of all partners, owners and operators

Owner Directed Compliance



• TSSA and other governing agencies allow each "unattended" industrial refrigeration plant owner to set their own level of regulation compliance

• However, there are some reasonable benchmarks to be used to assist both plant owners and TSSA inspectors to evaluate the level of risk – industry best practices

Access to ORFA Resources




• ORFA is a membership driven organization that restricts access to resources and related tools
