

Social Media Toolkit for Rep Day

Thank you for supporting CIVIX's Rep Day Program. In this social media toolkit you will find pre-written social media posts that you can use or adapt for your own social media accounts. We hope these tips and suggestions allow you to share your Rep Day visit on social media with ease!

Finding the time to take photos

- Depending on how you format the Rep Day meeting, the best time to capture photos may vary.
 The best time to take photos will most likely be during the elected official's presentation, Q&A period, or closing remarks.
- If you feel that you may be too busy to capture photos during the Rep Day meeting and the elected official has brought along an assistant or additional staff member, ask them if they could capture photos and share them via email after the visit.

Things to consider when taking photos

- Many schools already have policies that prohibit displaying children's faces, names, or
 identifying information on social media. Even if your school does not have any such policies, it is
 still recommended to avoid including children's faces in photos. Taking photos without
 children's faces takes a bit of creativity and thought but it is totally doable.
- Before taking a photo, try to step back to better fit your classroom and students into frame.

Things to consider when sharing photos on social media

- Share your Rep Day visit on your public professional social media accounts. Or, see if your school
 has its own dedicated social media profile(s) and share the photos with whomever runs the
 account.
